2019 Medical Program Accomplishments

- Served 40,938 patients
- Offered round-the-clock emergency services, treating 2848 patients, (2827 cases were treated at our own hospital, while only 21 cases were transported to city hospitals for specialized care.)
- Housed 513 patients in our 12-bed hospital.
- Performed 57 surgeries.
- Delivered 42 babies.
- Conducted 58 lab tests
- Treated 44 tuberculosis patients with full course of treatment (treatment can take up to 9 months)

2019 Prevention Program Accomplishments

- Served 56 villages and 29 Kindergarten schools in the prevention program
- Supplied 1700 children with nutritional supplements and vaccinations.
- Provided 371 pregnant women with prenatal care, nutritional supplements and vaccinations.
- Conducted 672 health education seminars in 56 villages
- Family Planning Results:
 - ✓ Visited 77412 pregnancy-age women throughout the year on a monthly, rotating basis for one-on-one meetings to build relationship and provide family planning consultation
 - ✓ Provided 110238 condoms, 2841 Mala Ds, 67 Copper-Ts and 44 multi-loads
 - ✓ Counseled and guided 352 women to the Block Government Hospital for tubal ligation and 1 man for vasectomy

New Programs in 2019


 $\bullet\,$ New class UKG added to our World Class English School. Now we have three classes, Nursery, LKG, and UKG.




